## **AR 600-20 Prohibited Relationships**

## **Two-Step Analysis:**

- 1) <u>Is the relationship expressly prohibited?</u> (Status Based Between Officers and Enlisted <u>or</u> NCOs (CPL through CSM) and Junior Enlisted Soldiers (PVT through SPC))
  - a. Ongoing business relationships prohibited
    - i. **NO GO** borrowing/lending money (no de minimis exceptions), commercial solicitation.
    - ii. Exceptions:
      - 1. OK "one-time transactions," landlord/tenant, sale of car.
      - 2. OK RC/NG relationships due to civilian employment.
  - b. **Gambling** prohibited
  - c. Dating and Shared Living Accommodations prohibited
    - i. Exceptions:
      - 1. OK Shared Living Accommodations if required by mission (deployment).
      - **2. OK** Marriages (but when faced with the "immaculate marriage" CDR should take "minimum action necessary" to maintain good order and discipline.
      - **3. OK** Dating relationships if there is a change in status i.e. activated or commissioned (have one year to marry or break-off the relationship).
      - **4. OK** Certain NG/RC "civilian" relationships.
  - d. Relationships Between Certain Other Personnel prohibited
    - i. Initial entry trainees & permanent party personnel: Any relationship not required by the mission.
    - ii. Recruiter & recruit (or potential recruit).
    - iii. Training Commands: Governed by supplemental regulations.
- 2) What is the actual or perceived effect of the relationship? (Effects Based between all ranks)
  - a. Does the relationship:
    - 1. Compromise the integrity of supervisory authority?
    - 2. Cause unfairness?
    - 3. Involve improper use of rank/position for personal gain?
    - 4. Appear or cause the perception that it is exploitive/coercive in nature?
    - 5. Create an adverse impact on good order & discipline/mission accomplishment?

## If actual or <u>perceived</u> – it is prohibited. If it looks wrong, it probably is wrong.

**Commander's response may include:** Counseling, reprimand, order to cease, reassignment, adverse administrative action, NJP, court-martial.
